If you're hitting the road for the holidays, remember to stay alert and drive slowly through construction zones. Drivers taking I-265 South should use extra caution when driving through the [new traffic split](#) near I-64. This long-term split of the southbound lanes will allow crews to replace asphalt in the area and continue work on the interchange reconfiguration.

### **Paving the way for a new lane**

What's better than one paver? How about two! Side-by-side pavers were out on the new ramp from I-265 North to I-64 East earlier this month. This ramp is being shifted out to make room for a new flyover ramp from I-265 North to I-64 West.

Incorporating side-by-side pavers that slowly move together not only enhances efficiency but also minimizes the likelihood of potential issues arising in the future due to the expansion of a joint.

Using this technique ensures long-term durability and functionality of the new ramp, providing a smooth and reliable connection for motorists traveling from I-265 North to I-64 East.



### Out with the old!

The traffic split on I-265 South has allowed crews to begin working on the center southbound lane. Earlier this month, the team utilized a milling machine to grind up the existing pavement. Watch [this video](#) to see the process in action!

### Moving into a new year

A lot is planned for I-Move Kentucky as the project moves into its final year! Drivers can expect continued blasting along I-71 as crews make space for an additional travel lane. A recent traffic switch that moved the southbound I-71 drivers to the inside lanes means crews will be able to make significant progress early next year in that area.

On the Gene Snyder, intermittent lane closures will be necessary as crews move farther north expanding I-265. Additional traffic impacts will also be expected at the I-64/265 interchange as the work on the new ramps moves ahead. Traffic alerts will be sent out in advance of these impacts.

## ABOUT I-MOVE KENTUCKY

The I-Move Kentucky project includes improvements to four major sections of I-265, I-71 and I-64 through a heavily traveled corridor in Jefferson and Oldham counties. Work on the I-Move project is scheduled to continue until summer of 2024.
