Two new sound walls have been installed on I-265 North, with three more planned along the Gene Snyder. Work also continued at the I-64/I-265 interchange, with crews continuing to bring in fill to support the new flyover ramp, and along I-71, where crews are making room for a new lane in each direction. Reconfiguring an interchange

In recent months, there has been a lot of progress at the I-64/I-265 interchange. Crews have poured the new flyover ramp over I-64 and constructed the concrete barrier separating the two lanes of traffic. Once complete, this ramp will carry drivers going from I-64 East to I-265 North and drivers going from I-265 North to I-64 West.

This month, crews will continue bringing in dirt to build up the area to the north of the flyover ramp. More information about what's planned for the interchange can be found at I-MoveKY.com.

New guardrail!

Did you notice the new guardrail on I-265 past Westport Road (Exit 32)? Crews worked hard this month to get the guardrail installed and to set the cable barrier just south of the area. Two different types of medians, guardrail and cable barriers are both important for keeping traffic safe on roadways. Now that these are installed, crews can prepare to shift traffic to the inside lanes so they can work on the outside lane and shoulder.

Blasting on I-71

Blasting has been an ongoing process along I-71 to make way for a new lane in each direction. Recently, crews were out blasting along northbound I-71 near the rest area. In the next few weeks, work will wrap up there, and crews will move to the southbound side for more blasting. Drivers can expect rolling traffic stoppages weekday afternoons while blasting continues.

Traffic shift on I-265

The long-term traffic split on I-265 North between the I-64/I-265 interchange and U.S. 60/Shelbyville Road will soon come to an end, with a new traffic split being implemented on the southbound lanes. More information about the new traffic split will be released this afternoon.

The I-Move Kentucky project includes improvements to four major sections of I-265, I-71 and I-64 through a heavily traveled corridor in Jefferson and Oldham counties. Work on the I-Move project is scheduled to continue until summer of 2024.
